Breed Highlight

Whippets
Starring Sonny

Resembling a small Greyhound the Whippet hails from England but may trace their lineage back to ancient Egypt.

Whippets are a hunting sight hound who were once used as warren dogs for catching rabbits and racing. They are also possibly the fastest accelerating dog breed! Their speed was one of the reasons they were such a successful hunting dog.

The Whippet became known as "the poor man's greyhound" and was frequently used for poaching and rabbit coursing to fill the pot.

Today Whippets are tough competition in both the lure racing sports, flyball, dock diving and couch stealing.



Underdog Training and Behaviour Consulting, Tips and Classes

Training Tips:

Teach your dog Boundaries:

- 1. Have your dog on leaf and open the door or gate slightly- the moment your dog goes to exit without you giving the cue to do so, close the door. You will need to repeat this step many times before opening the door wider and doing the same thing.
- 2. Reward your dog for waiting when the door/gate is open. Toss the food reward away from the exit rather than right at the threshold.
- 3. Use a release word whenever you are happy for your dog to exit try to chose a word not common in conversation free, play, walk, release are common examples.


